Ukrtelecom enhances Ukrainian military capabilities with new drone donation



Ukrtelecom has delivered a new batch of specialized UAVs to the Ukrainian army as part of Rinat Akhmetov's Steel Front military initiative. The latest consignment, comprising one hundred domestically produced drones, will help Ukrainian warriors in their combat missions.
