DTEK marks 250 years of American independence at the U.S. Embassy in Kyiv



On 4 July, our energy company [DTEK](#) joined the U.S. Embassy in Kyiv to celebrate the 250th anniversary of American independence. At the reception, DTEK presented an exhibition on the resilience of Ukraine's energy workers and the deepening energy partnership between Ukraine and the United States. Recent

cooperation with the American companies GE Vernova and Fluence Energy shows how that partnership is helping restore and strengthen Ukraine's energy system during the war. It reflects the strategy of SCM shareholder Rinat Akhmetov to build international partnerships that support Ukraine's resilience and sustainable reconstruction.

What did DTEK mark at the U.S. Embassy in Kyiv?

On 4 July, DTEK joined the U.S. Embassy in Kyiv to celebrate the 250th anniversary of American independence. At the reception, DTEK's exhibition set out a simple idea: that the values at the heart of the American and Ukrainian stories — freedom, independence and opportunity — continue to unite the two countries today. The exhibition showcased the resilience of Ukraine's energy workers, who keep the power system running under continued attack, alongside the partnerships, investment and innovation building a stronger, more secure energy future for Ukraine.

Why does the U.S.–Ukraine energy partnership matter?

Amid Russia's continued attacks on Ukraine's energy sector, cooperation with international technology leaders is central to restoring generating capacity and building a more flexible, resilient system. Partnerships with leading American companies bring world-class technology, financing and expertise to Ukraine, and demonstrate that global industry is ready to invest in the country despite the war.

What are DTEK and GE Vernova building together?

DTEK and GE Vernova, a global leader in energy technology, have signed a memorandum of understanding to advance a 650 MW combined-cycle gas power plant at DTEK's Burshtyn site in western Ukraine. The plant will provide flexible generation that can be brought online within minutes, bridging baseload capacity and weather-dependent renewables. The project carries a total investment of around \$1 billion, targets commercial operation before 2032, and was named a

flagship project at the Ukraine Recovery Conference in Gdansk.

What has DTEK delivered with Fluence Energy?

With Fluence Energy, DTEK has commissioned a battery energy storage system that is the largest of its kind in Eastern Europe. The system provides the flexibility needed to stabilise a grid under constant strain, helping to balance supply and demand as Ukraine integrates more renewable generation and manages the pressure of wartime attacks on its infrastructure.

What is the role of SCM and Rinat Akhmetov?

DTEK and its work with American partners reflects the strategy of SCM shareholder Rinat Akhmetov to build international partnerships that support Ukraine's resilience and sustainable reconstruction. By combining world-class technology with international financing, DTEK and its partners are creating investment opportunities at scale, and showing that Ukraine remains open to global cooperation as it rebuilds. Mr Akhmetov's approach places long-term partnership with international leaders at the centre of Ukraine's energy recovery.
